

#### Farewell Mr. Virden; thank you for 40 great years!!


After working for Lorain Metropolitan Housing for 40 years, Mr. Virden, is going to move on to his next journey; retirement!!

Mr. Virden was gracious enough to take the time to answer questions about his time here at LMHA and also about what the future holds for him. Here is what he had to say:

# 1. What year did you begin working at the housing authority; who was president?

Lorain Metropolitan Housing Authority hired me January 5, 1981 as the Supervisor of Energy Control. Ronald Reagan was president of the United States. I was assigned to develop a utility allowance system to convert the Authority family units from authority paid utilities to tenant paid utili-

ties. I also coordinated the weatherization of LMHA units and the conversion to energy efficient boilers and low use water toilets.



I have held several positions with the Authority. The ones I remember include Director of Physical Plant, Administrative Assistant to the Director, Contract Compliances, Hearing Officer, and Assistant Director. They all were favorites as each was essential to my development and to understanding of providing housing.

**3.** What is a favorite memory that you have about working for LMHA? One of my favorite memories is standing with everyone, smiling, at the Oberlin LIHTC ribbon cutting. There was a feeling that we crossed the finish line as a winner.

**4.** What have you learned from your experiences here at the housing authority? I learned that the work of providing housing to those in need is never done. All we can do is our part during our time.

**5.** Are you excited about your next journey? Life is a journey, not a destination, so always enjoy the trip. My plans are to enjoy time with my family.

6. What are you going to miss most about working at LMHA?

I have heard from many LMHA retirees that you are so busy when you retire, you do not have time to miss LMHA.

# Extension Cord Safety Tips:

Extension cords are meant for temporary use only.

Do not run extension cords under rugs or furniture.

Never plug an extension cord into another extension cord.

Make sure extension cords are properly rated for their use, never use an indoor extension cord outdoors.

Inspect cords for damage before use. Check for cracks and frayed sockets, loose or bare wires, and loose connections. Discard damaged extension cords immediately.

Never tamper with your smoke detector. If an extension cord causes a fire, you want to be aware immediately so that you can be safe.

Never use a cord that feels hot.

Never use a three prong plug with outlets that only have two slots for the plug.

### LCCAA Partners to Bridge Digital Divide

Lorain County Community Action Agency will partner with area schools to help students bridge the digital divide and help them learn safely in their homes. LCCAA has been awarded \$50,000 from the City of Lorain's COVID Response Grant Program, funded by the CARES Act. The agency will purchase 200 internet enabled devices to distribute to schools based on enrollment and need.
